

☑ De-identification Checklist

When is this used? Anytime an individual wishes to de-identify something contains Protected Health Information (PHI).

Why is this used? To de-identify a document or item that contains Protected Health Information.

Under HIPAA's De-Identification Standard, health information is not individually identifiable if it does not identify an individual and if there is no reasonable basis to believe it can be used to identify an individual.

Identifiers to be Removed
